with a one-month holiday in June.**

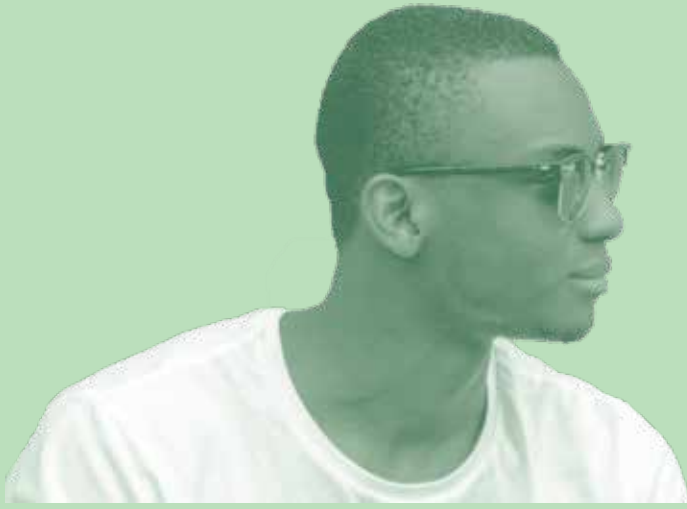
/ Dates: Friday, 31 January 2020 - Monday, 30 November 2020

M e n t o r s h i p :

Life can get busy and a lot of the time we neglect the simple act of sitting down to have heart-to-heart discussions. We have seen the value of being mentored, and for this reason you will be encouraged to meet with the various elders and staff throughout the year. The mentors will be those who will add value and insight into your life and help you throughout the programme.



A glance at a typical week:

The programme will run five days a week with Tuesday and Saturday being your days off. ie: It will run on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Sunday. Although the office hours are from 9am-5pm, there will be many instances where you may need to arrive earlier or leave later when there are events.

You will be involved, along with the Church-on-Main staff, in serving at all the main events hosted by Church-on-Main throughout the year.

Each event includes numerous aspects which the coMission team will be involved in, such as: worship, catering, set up of the facility, childcare, admin, sound and media production and others.

Regular street ministry, led by one of the pastors, will build your faith and encourage you.



Bursary and Financial Aid


We will be offering two bursaries for 2020. Each will be to the value of R30,000 which will go towards your living expenses for the year. Applications for the bursaries will close 29 November 2019.

The first bursary will be awarded to a candidate who shows potential but would otherwise not be able to attend the programme, due to financial constraints.

The second bursary will be awarded to any candidate who has a skill/s which will be beneficial to the team.

What is the *application* process?

**There are a number of simple but important steps to follow
in order to complete your application successfully.
Applications close 9 December 2019.**

STEP ONE: APPLY

Complete the online application request on the website. You will then receive the downloadable application form. Please print it, fill it in and scan it back to us at comission@churchonmain.org.za

STEP TWO: PASTORAL LETTER

Ask your current pastor to write a letter of recommendation for you. They can email the letter directly to comission@churchonmain.org.za with your name, surname and coMission as the subject.

STEP THREE: BURSARY MOTIVATION

If you will be applying for either of the two bursaries, please write a motivation letter as to why you think you deserve the bursary.

STEP FOUR: INTERVIEW

Once your completed application has been received, you will be contacted by Church-on-Main to schedule an interview appointment (via Skype or telephonically if you are not from Cape Town).

STEP FIVE: NOTIFICATION

You will receive notification as to whether your application has been successful or not one week after the interview has taken place.
